



Income-Eligible Weatherization



Sometimes an unexpected illness or job loss turns your finances upside down...or your fixed income just doesn't stretch far enough. When that happens, KCP&L's Income-Eligible Weatherization program may be able to help.

Reduce your energy usage up to 35%, and save on your heating and cooling bills by weatherizing your home.

KCP&L's Income-Eligible Weatherization program enables qualifying families to save money and improve safety and energy efficiency by reducing their energy use. Through this program, experts install energy-efficiency measures free of charge that help keep your home's temperature comfortable, no matter the weather conditions.

Typical services may include:

- **Installing insulation**
- **Air sealing cracks and gaps on windows**
- **Repairing heating and central A/C systems**

Can you answer Yes to any of these questions?

- Do you struggle to make ends meet?
- Do you want to improve the health and safety of your home?
- Do you want to save money and energy by making your home more energy efficient?

Who is eligible for the program?

Both homeowners and renters can qualify for the program. To be eligible, you must be a KCP&L customer and have:

Homeowners

- **Household earnings at or below** the current federal income guidelines for weatherization.
- **Received electric service from KCP&L** for a minimum of one year.
- Household energy consumption of **at least 3,000 kWh per year**.

Renters

- **Responsibility for the payment** of electricity bills.
- **An agreement under contract with a local weatherization provider** that your landlord will not raise the rent for at least two years in Missouri and one year in Kansas from the date of completion of installation of the energy-efficiency measures.
- **Approval** from your landlord.

How to apply

You can apply through your local community action agency. (See list in this brochure). Applications are taken year-round.

How does the agency determine which weatherization measures will be installed?

Energy auditors will survey your home and input current information in the National Energy Audit Tool (NEAT). This tool will then recommend energy efficient improvements you can make to your home based on its current status.

Other benefits to weatherization

- **Helps resolve energy-efficiency concerns** before energy bills get too high.
- **Allows you to spend money saved** on other household expenses.
